3 Technical: Twin poles, any other technical issues

AUS: there is no interest in twin poles, nor in CAN. Several other NCAs are also against it. Cost of second-hand boats would increase. Twin poles work very well with bow-launch spinnakers, but less so with spinnakers out of bags. Pros of discussion about twin-poles: we've looked at a lot of alternatives. There is nothing in the rules to stop you from whatever you want to do with ONE pole. There are certain advantages to twin poles. If UKFA wants to, write a proposal and we'll send it out and have a vote on it. We would also have to define height of take-off points for spinnaker poles.
